- **1. Get Your Paper Ballot:** Go to your polling place, check-in, and receive your paper ballot from the poll worker.
- **2. Initiate the Voting Session:** Insert the paper ballot into the feeder with the notch in and to the right.
- **3. Make Selections:** Using the screen, touch the candidate of your choice or write-in a desired candidate.
- **4. Print Your Ballot:** Touch PRINT and your selections will print out in the window on the right.
- **5. Verify your Vote:** In the window on the right, review and verify selections.
- **6. Cast your Vote:** Press VOTE and your ballot is scanned, tabulated, and stored in the secure ballot container.
















JOINING THE PA BREAST CANCER COALITION

VICTORY FOR DOMESTIC VIOLENCE SURVIVORS

On June 28th the Pennsylvania Budget was passed with a historic 10% increase in funds for Domestic Violence and Rape Crisis programs. While many other Pennsylvania Budget items received no increase, this priority item for Senator Hughes and the PA Senate Democratic Caucus, received one of the largest increases in the state's history.

NEW HOTLINE SAVING LIVES







As a result of a successful legislative effort led by Senator Hughes, Pennsylvania now has a new Hotline entitled Safe2Say Something, which is designed for high school students to report threats to themselves or others.

This tip line went live in January of 2019, and by July more than 25,000 tips had been received. Originally designed to report violent school safety threats, the overwhelming number of calls has been to report concerns of suicide, bullying and depression.

Working with Attorney General Josh Shapiro, who administers the program, it is clear that Safe2Say has been valuable to young people looking for support, and it has opened a window to the levels of stress and trauma that our students are confronting.

Senator Hughes urges every high school in Pennsylvania to adapt and fully implement Safe2Say.
