n Oct. of 2019, Gov. Tom Wolf signed Act 77 into law, bringing Pennsylvania some of the most progressive changes in voting regulations in the nation. Early voting and expanded voter registration are now a part of Pennsylvania's voting rules and regulations. Senator Hughes has been at the forefront of the legislative and advocacy efforts to enact these major reforms. He brought the National Commission for Voter Justice to Drexel University to take testimony, convened regional pubic officials at Philadelphia City Hall in a listening session on voter reform, organized voter reform press conferences in the State Capitol in Harrisburg, and much more. This is a big victory for democracy and the Senator is grateful for your advocacy and support in this fight.


### **GET INVOLVED:** *PROTECT THE AFFORDABLE CARE ACT FROM ATTACK*

pressure on the General Assembly to get these bills passed.


